Call for Papers

Statement of purpose

The *Malawi Journal of Education and Development* is a peer-reviewed multidisciplinary journal published by the University of Malawi's School of Education, whose major aim is to publish outstanding critical research findings at the frontiers of education and sustainable development. The journal publishes articles that focus on relevant social, economic, political or cultural issues in education which have an impact on sustainable development. Thus, the journal welcomes multidisciplinary articles that integrate different perspectives. *MJED* therefore particularly focuses on development from the perspective of education. It also focuses on education from the perspective of an analysis of its social-economic, political and cultural implications on sustainable development.

Although MJED has a special focus on the Malawi context, its aim and scope is to include contributors and readers from different countries, across Africa and beyond. The Journal hopes to have this reflected in the variety of topics, approaches and contexts (cultural, socio-economic) in its articles. *MJED* strives to publish articles written in a clear style, avoiding esoteric jargon, in order to address the needs and interests of the readers of different levels of expertise across disciplines and geographical spread.

This is call for papers to be published month-end of June, 2023.

Notes for contributors

- i) The manuscript should be original, and should not have been published previously. Do not submit material that is currently being considered by another journal.
- ii) The manuscript should not be longer than 7000 words, double spacing, Times New Roman, 12 point font, 3cm margins all round including an abstract, texts, tables, footnotes, appendixes, and references. **All of these must be written in APA format**.

- **iii)** The title should not exceed 15 words, and an abstract of up to 200 words should precede the main text, accompanied by a maximum of 6 key words or phrases.
- **iv)** The first page of the article should carry the complete title, but no names, of the author(s). The complete title and the names of the authors should be typed on a separate sheet to ensure anonymity in the review process.
- **v)** The manuscript should be edited before submission, with the editor's confirmatory note attached
- vi) The manuscript should be in MS Word format, UK-English, submitted as an email attachment to the Editor-in-Chief through our email address:
