Purpose and Scope

The Malawi Journal of Education and Development (MJED) is a peer-reviewed multidisciplinary journal published by the University of Malawi's School of Education. The journal's primary aim is to publish research findings at the interface of education and sustainable development. MJED welcomes scholarly articles that examine the social, economic, political, or cultural dimensions of education and their implications for sustainable development.

While MJED has a particular focus on the Malawian context, it also seeks to attract contributions and readers from across Africa and beyond. The journal reflects this diversity in its range of topics, methodologies, and contexts, aiming to foster dialogue and knowledge sharing among researchers, practitioners, and policymakers worldwide.

MJED prioritises clarity and accessibility to address the needs of a diverse audience, including academics, graduate students, educators, and policymakers, across various disciplines and levels of expertise.

Sections of the Journal

MJED publishes articles in the following sections, catering to various scholarly and practical contributions:

1. Research articles

- Features rigorous theoretical and empirical research studies addressing critical questions in education and development.
- Includes systematic reviews, meta-analyses, and conceptual studies that advance understanding in the field.

2. Graduate Research

 Provides a platform for graduate students to showcase their research contributions.

3. Educational Development

- Focuses on practical insights, including policy briefs, case studies of practice, prototypes, and other designs in education.
- Aims to share actionable knowledge from projects, programmes, or innovations that contribute to sustainable development.
- Authors publishing in this section are required to contribute a minimum of USD50 (or equivalent in Malawi Kwacha)
 per A4 output page in PDF format. This fee supports technology, peer review, and overhead costs.

Publication Schedule and Submission

MJED accepts manuscript submissions at any time throughout the year. The journal publishes twice annually, in **June** and **December**, providing timely dissemination of research and insights in education and development.

Editorial Policy and Review Process

Double-Blind Peer Review

MJED employs a double-blind peer review process to maintain objectivity and ensure high-quality publications.

- Authors are required to anonymise their manuscripts and any supplementary materials before submission.
- A separate title page containing the article title, author names, affiliations, and contact information must be submitted. This page should also include acknowledgements, disclosures, and funding information, where applicable.

Proofreading and Plagiarism Checks

Authors are encouraged to:

- Edit and proofread their manuscripts thoroughly to ensure clarity, accuracy, and professionalism.
- Check for plagiarism using widely accepted tools such as Turnitin or Grammarly to maintain originality and adhere to ethical standards.

Special Issues

The journal publishes special or guest-edited issues. Articles in these

issues undergo the same rigorous review process as regular submissions. Guest editors cannot handle the review of their own submissions.

Submission Guidelines

General Requirements

- Submissions must be original, unpublished, and not under consideration elsewhere.
- Manuscripts must adhere to **UK English** conventions
- Manuscripts must be between 5,000 and 7,500 words, including the abstract, main text, tables, figures, footnotes, appendices, and references.

Formatting Instructions

- 1. Use **Times New Roman, 12-point font**, double-spaced, with **3cm margins** on all sides.
- 2. The manuscript must begin with a **title page** (detailed below) followed by an abstract of **150–250 words** and **4–6 keywords**.
- 3. References and citations must follow **APA 7th Edition** guidelines (see below for details).

Title Page Requirements

The title page must include:

- The title of the manuscript (maximum of 15 words);
- The full names of all authors, their affiliations, and institutional addresses;
- The email address and phone number of the corresponding author;
- Any acknowledgements, disclosures, or funding information.

Submission Process

Manuscripts must be submitted as email attachments in **Microsoft**

Word format to the Editor-in-Chief at mjed@unima.ac.mw.

Ethical Policies

Authors are required to declare that their manuscript is original, has not

been published elsewhere, and is not under consideration by another

journal. Plagiarism or the inclusion of copyrighted materials without

appropriate permissions is prohibited.

Publication Fees

MJED does not charge authors for submission or article processing

charges (APCs). However, manuscripts accepted for the Educational

Development section will incur a monetary contribution of USD50 per

In-Text Citations

APA in-text citations follow the author-date format. Examples include:

• Single Author: (Smith, 2020) or Smith (2020).

• **Two Authors**: (Smith & Jones, 2021) or Smith and Jones (2021).

• Three or More Authors: (Smith et al., 2021).

• **Direct Quotes**: Include page numbers: (Smith, 2020, p. 23).

References are listed alphabetically with a hanging indent. Below are examples for common formats:

1. **Book**

2. Chapter in Edited Book
