The University of Malawi is inviting applications for various Postgraduate Programmes which will commence in September 2025.

GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR MASTER'S DEGREES

The following are the **minimum application requirements** for all Master's degree programmes:

- a. A letter of application or a filled PG1 form to be downloaded from our website <www.unima.ac.mw>
- b. A Bachelor's degree from an accredited university with at least a credit. Candidates with a strong pass may be considered.
- c. A detailed CV.
- d. Certified or notarised copies of academic transcripts and certificates.
- e. Two letters of reference from traceable referees (one of which shall be an academician) are to be submitted in sealed envelopes or as PDF attachments.
- f. A copy of the bank deposit slip for the application fee of **MK20,000** for Malawian nationals and **US\$50** for international applicants. Please indicate the name of the programme you are applying for and deposit the money into the following account: Chanco Sundry Income, Account No: 282553, held at the National Bank of Malawi, Zomba Service Centre.
- g. Evidence of sponsorship: Preference will be given to applicants who will present credible evidence of funding for their studies.
- h. Candidates must sign on the 2025 PG1 Form that they have satisfied all the general entry requirements.

NOTE: Specific programmes may have additional requirements which must be complied with. Incomplete applications will not be processed.

GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR PHD DEGREES In addition to the general requirements above, applications for doctoral degree programmes should meet the following **minimum conditions:**

- a. A good Master's degree from an accredited university. Candidates with work experience will have an added advantage.
- b. A concept note detailing the proposed research topic in terms of objectives, approach and research questions.
- c. Sample of applicant's written academic work.

CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

- a) Unless specifically indicated, all Master's degree programmes are full-time and will run for 24 months. The first year is for course work while the second year is for research and thesis writing. PhD programmes run for 3 years (full-time) and up to 5 years (part-time).
- b) The tuition fees cover costs of registration, examinations, supervision and institutional overheads. Students are expected to meet the costs of research, accommodation, meals, medical cover, books, stationery and learning materials.
- c) The University does not provide accommodation and the students will be required to look for their accommodation outside the campus.
- d) All programmes operate on a no-fee no-classes basis. Applicants will be expected to demonstrate how they will support their studies either through a letter of commitment from their sponsors or a bank statement.

SPECIFIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAMMES

The following are the specific details of the advertised programmes:

1. SCHOOL OF ARTS, COMMUNICATION AND DESIGN

(a) DEPARTMENT OF DRAMA AND THEATRE

Name of Programme: Master of Arts in Theatre and Media Communications in Development (MA TMCD)

Programme Description: This interdisciplinary programme enables students to critically examine a range of theoretical, methodological and practical approaches to the study of Communication for Development, with specific emphasis on theatre and media. The training covers a range of current media industries including theatre, broadcast (radio and TV), print and digital media modes.

Programme Duration: 2 years with the first year offered on block release and the second year consisting of practice-based and supervised research leading to dissertation writing.

Fee Structure: MK5,500,000.00 for Malawian nationals; and US \$7,644.00 for international students for the 2 years.

Additional Entry Requirements: A Bachelor's degree with credit in the fields of development theatre, media, and communication studies from an accredited university. Candidates with a strong pass may be considered, alongside work experience in theatre, media and communications-related fields.

2. SCHOOL OF HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

(a) DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

Name of Programme: (i) Master of Arts in Applied Ethics

List of Courses Offered: *Core modules:* African Moral Practice and the Ethical Theory, Moral Decision-Making, Biomedical Ethics, Research Methods and Methodology, Environmental Ethics, and Business Ethics. *Elective Modules:* Developmental Ethics, Public Health Ethics, Public and Private Sector Ethics, and Morality, Law, Politics and the Media.

Duration of Programme: 2 years and programme has taught course components delivered through block release or weekend classes in the first year followed by supervised research leading to a dissertation in the second year. Students with no background in Ethics will be required to take a bridging module, *General Ethics*.

Additional Entry Requirements: Bachelor's or Honours degree in any field of study with credit or strong pass with a minimum of three years of work experience.

Fee Structure: Tuition fees for the whole program are MK5,500,000 for Malawian nationals, US\$6,000 for SADC students, and US\$8,000 for international students for the entire 2-year period.

Name of Programme: (ii) Master of Arts in Philosophy (by Research)

List of Research Areas: History of Philosophy; Continental Philosophy and Analytic Philosophy, Metaphysics Epistemology, Philosophy of Language and Logic, Social and Political Philosophy, Phenomenology & Existentialism, African Philosophy, Applied Ethics.

Mode of Delivery: This programme has two components: a taught course component delivered in the first semester of Year 1 where students will be required to attend compulsory seminars running every **Saturday for 5 weeks**. The second component will involve research leading to a supervised dissertation.

Additional Entry Requirements: A Bachelor's Degree in Philosophy or Bachelor's Degree majoring in Philosophy with Credit; or A Bachelor's Degree in Philosophy or a Bachelor's Degree majoring in Philosophy with a pass and a minimum of three years of working experience; or An Honours Degree in Philosophy. Only qualifications from universities recognized by the University of Malawi will be accepted.

Fee Structure: MK4,500,000 for Malawian nationals for the entire two years. US\$4,500 for SADC students, and US\$6,000 for international students

Name of Programme: (iii) Doctor of Philosophy in Philosophy

List of Research Areas: Metaphysics, Epistemology, Philosophy of Language, Logic, Philosophy of Science and Technology, Ethics, Social and Political Philosophy, Phenomenology & Existentialism, Critical Theory, and African Philosophy.

Mode of Delivery: This programme is a three-year academic programme. Delivery shall be on a full-time and part-time basis. Students will be required to attend compulsory seminars. The research component will be divided into quarterly reports, which will be examined by a supervisory committee. Students will be required to present their work in progress at these meetings and will be allowed to proceed after satisfying the examiners.

Additional Entry Requirements: A Master's Degree in Philosophy or a related field. Only qualifications recognized by the National Council for Higher Education will be accepted.

Fee Structure: MK3,000,000 per year for Malawian nationals years. US\$3,500 for SADC students, and US\$6,000 for international students.

(b) DEPARTMENT OF LANGUAGES, LINGUISTICS AND CLASSICAL STUDIES

Names of Programmes:

- (i) MA in Pure Linguistics
- (ii) MA in Applied Linguistics
- (iii) PhD in Pure Linguistics
- (iv) PhD in Applied Linguistics

Entry Requirements:

Applicants for MA degrees should have a good first degree with credit or its equivalent in the appropriate subject. Applicants with a strong pass mark and relevant work experience shall also be considered. Applicants who have not studied core courses in Linguistics for their BA will be required to go through a bridging course before they are admitted into any of the programmes.

Applicants into the PhD Programme should already have completed an MA degree. Subject to certain conditions, research students may be accepted on a part-time basis or, under approved arrangements, to work off campus.

Duration of Programme: For the MA degree, it is 2 years maximum (Full-time) or 3 years (Part-time). For the PhD degree, it is 3 years full-time.

Fee Structure: For MA degrees MK2,700,000 per year for Malawian nationals, and US\$4,500 per year for international students. For PhD degrees MK6,750,000 for Malawian nationals and \$7,575 for international students for the entire period of study. Fees for bridging, are MK200,000 for Malawian nationals and \$300 for international students.

(c) DEPARTMENT OF THEOLOGY AND RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Name of Programme: Master of Theology and Religious Studies

Additional Entry Requirements: Bachelor's degree in Theology and Religious Studies or any other relevant first degree.

Fee Structure: MK4,500,000 for Malawian nationals and US\$6,000 for international students for the entire two years.

(d) DEPARTMENT OF LITERARY STUDIES

Names of Programmes:

- i. MA in Literary and Cultural Studies**
- ii. Doctor of Philosophy in Literature**

Programme Description: The MA (Literary and Cultural Studies) and PhD (Literature) programmes aim to develop critical skills in the appreciation of the relevance of literary works to the development of a nation; and build capacity that will service different government departments and NGOs in the fields such as teaching/research, culture and advocacy; and, finally, produce a cadre of literature scholars adept in the critiquing of literary and cultural works from all over the globe.

Eligibility Criteria

i. MA in Literary and Cultural Studies

Entry into the MA (Literary and Cultural Studies) programme will be open to candidates who are holders of a good first degree (credit+) or its equivalent with English literature as a major subject. The MA in Literary and Cultural Studies (by research) is only open to candidates who can satisfy the department that they already have a sound grasp of literary/critical tools for analysing a clearly defined body of literary texts or traditions of their choice. This MA involves training in research methods, such course work as may be deemed necessary and a dissertation for which the degree is awarded.

ii. Doctor of Philosophy in Literature (Full Time)

To be admitted into a PhD in literature Programme, candidates should already have completed an MA. If this is not the case, the candidate may be accepted initially for the MA with the provision that if his/her performance is satisfactory, he/she will then be permitted to continue to a PhD. Subject to certain conditions, research students may be accepted on a part-time basis or, under approved arrangements, to work off campus. Applications for the PhD should be accompanied by a 3-page concept note detailing the proposed research topic. Candidates are advised to make their concept notes as specific as possible, and to send in a piece of their written work relevant to the proposed field of study along with their application.

Programme Duration: Maximum of 2 years (full-time or by research) for MA in Literary and Cultural Studies; maximum of 3 years for PhD in Literature.

Fees Structure: Actual fees for the MA in Literary and Cultural Studies programme is MK2, 500, 000.00 per year. The fee for the PhD in Literature is MK3,000,000.00 per year.

(e) DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY AND POPULATION STUDIES

(i) Name of Programme: Master of Arts in Sociology

Applications are invited from motivated social scientists to pursue a two-year research programme in the Sociology Department at the University of Malawi leading to the award of a Master of Arts Degree in Sociology.

Duration: This is a two-year programme and students are expected to develop a proposal, and conduct field research under Department assigned mentors in the first year. During the second year, students are expected to develop a thesis.

Specific Entry Requirements: To qualify for admission, an applicant should have a good bachelor's degree from a recognised university majoring in Sociology/Social Anthropology/ Gender Studies/ Social Work. The applicant must have covered Introductory Sociology and demonstrated competence in Sociological Theories and Social Research Methods.

A complete application dossier must include the following: a one-paged motivation letter, a concept note (maximum of two pages), three copies of completed application forms (University of Malawi PG1), updated curriculum vitae, two academic references, copies of diplomas and degrees and an academic transcript and deposit slip for the application fee.

Fee Structure: K MK 2,225,000 per year for Malawian students and \$2500 per year for international students

(ii) Name of Programme: PhD in Sociology (By Research)

Fee Structure: MK2,000,000.00 per year for Malawian nationals and USD 3,000 per academic year for International students.

Duration of Programme: 3-5 years

Programme Description: Candidates will undergo a compulsory research methods course before the commencement of their research studies. Candidates will later be expected to work with allocated supervisors on their research topics during which they will make at least two presentations one on the proposal and the other on the findings. Each candidate is also expected to publish articles in scholarly journals before the completion of the study.

Additional Entry Requirements: Prospective candidates must be capable of carrying out independent sociological research, using and exchanging ideas to improve and critically analyse societal phenomena and development interventions. Candidates should have a strong Master's degree in Sociology,

Development Studies and other social science fields from a recognised institution. Candidates from Development Studies and other social science fields will be considered if they have some background in Sociology at undergraduate or Master's levels.

(f) DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY, ARCHAEOLOGY AND HERITAGE STUDIES

Master of Arts in African Social and Economic History

The programme is organised around a modular system and candidates may have the option of choosing either the MA (African Social History) or the MA (African Economic History) routes.

Duration: 24 months (full-time)

Specific Entry Requirements: To qualify for admission to this programme, applicants must have a Bachelor's degree with credit in history or related disciplines obtained from accredited institutions of higher learning. Applicants with a strong pass in their first degree (55% and above average) and relevant work experience will also be considered.

Fee Structure: MK4,200,000 for the entire period of study for Malawian nationals; U\$6,720 for SADC and U\$9,580 for Non-SADC students for a similar period of study.

3. SCHOOL OF LAW, ECONOMICS AND GOVERNANCE

(a) DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

(i) Name of Programme: Master of Arts Degree in Economics (Full time)

Programme Structure: The MA in Economics is offered jointly by the University of Malawi (www.economics.unima.ac.mw) and the African Economic Research Consortium (AERC) (www.aercafrica.org), in two components. In the first component, students spend their first year doing coursework before

embarking on thesis preparation under the supervision of senior faculty in the second year. The first semester of coursework year is spent while in residence at Chancellor College in Zomba and the second semester takes students to the Joint Facility of Electives in Nairobi, Kenya. The facility draws students from leading universities in Anglophone Africa.

Additional Entry Requirements: Applicants should have a first degree majoring in Economics from an accredited institution. Those with a background in quantitative methods will have an added advantage.

Scholarships: Under the auspices of AERC, the Department of Economics offers a limited number of partial scholarships to outstanding candidates. Applicants are, however, encouraged to identify other sources of funding.

Fee Structure: MK8,250,000.00 per student for Malawian nationals and US\$10,000.00 per student for international students for the entire two-year programme.

(g) DEPARTMENT OF POLITICS AND GOVERNMENT

(i) Name of Programme: Master of Public Administration and Management (MPAM)

Description of Programme: The programme consists of a taught coursework component in the first year, followed by independent research and preparation of an examinable thesis in the second year.

Duration and Mode of Delivery: MPAM is a two-year block release programme of study and students are expected to attend classes for three consecutive weeks in every quarter of the first year of coursework. In each quarter students will take two courses. All classes take place at Chancellor College in Zomba.

Additional Entry Requirements: Applicants should have either a minimum of a credit Bachelor's degree in Public Administration, Political Science, Human Resources Management or Business Administration offered by an accredited institution of higher learning and a minimum of two years of work experience; or a minimum of a credit Bachelor's Degree in any discipline but holding a managerial position in the public service having worked for at least two years. Applicants with a credit bachelor's degree in the relevant disciplines

with a strong pass will be considered if they have at least three years of work experience. The work experience requirement will be waived for those persons belonging to marginalised, disadvantaged or underrepresented social groups such as those with disabilities of any kind. Applicants should also submit a two-page typed brief of proposed research interests in the chosen discipline of study.

Fee Structure: MK7,000,000.00 for Malawian nationals and US\$ 7,500 for international students for the entire two-year programme.

(ii) Name of Programme: Master of Arts in Political Science

Description of Programme: The programme consists of a taught coursework component in the first year, followed by independent research and preparation of an examinable thesis in the second year.

Duration: 2 years (Full time)

Additional Entry Requirements: Applicants should have a strong Bachelor's degree with a credit or strong pass in Political Science or Public Administration. Applicants with a degree in Humanities and Social Sciences from an accredited institution will be considered if they have some Political Science subjects in their undergraduate programmes. Applicants should also submit a two-page typed brief of proposed research interests in the chosen discipline of study.

Fee Structure: MK5,500,000.00 for Malawian nationals and US\$ 6,500 for international students for the entire two-year programme.

(iii) Name of Programme: PhD in Public Administration (By Research)
Programme Description: This is a full-time PhD programme by research, including supervisors' guided reading. During the entire period of study, candidates will be required to participate in scheduled scholarly activities

arranged by the Department. These activities include seminars, reading exercises and presentations, and offering tutorials to MA and BA students in Public Administration.

Fee Structure: The tuition fee is MK13,500,000 for the whole period for Malawian nationals and US\$ 4,800.00 per academic year for international students.

Duration of Programme: 3-5 years

Additional Entry Requirements: Applicants to be considered for the PhD in Public Administration should have a strong Master's degree in Public Administration/ Management/ Political Science or related disciplines obtained from accredited institutions of higher learning. Applicants who can demonstrate a strong prior experience in research will have an added advantage.

NOTE: Under the newly introduced Richard Tambulasi Memorial Postgraduate Scholarship, a total of three scholarships will be awarded to students pursuing a Master's degree in the Department of Political and Administrative Studies. The Department of Political and Administrative Studies offers Master of Public Administration and Management, Master of Arts (Human Resource Management and Industrial Relations) and Master of Arts (Political Science). Awardees will be selected through a competitive process. For their thesis, awardees will have to research one of the themes that were core to the scholarship of Professor Richard Tambulasi.

(vi) Name of Programme: Master of Arts in Development Studies

Duration: 2 years (full-time)

Programme Description: The programme consists of a taught coursework component in the first academic year, followed by the preparation of an examinable thesis in the second year. The coursework will be undertaken in two semesters during which a total of 8 courses will be offered from the following list: Theories of Development; Research Methods for Development Studies; Rural Development; Development Economics; Political Economy of Development; African Economic History; Policy Analysis and Economic

Management; Development Administration; Gender and Development; Environment and Sustainable Development.

Additional Entry Requirements: Applicants should have a minimum of credit at a Bachelor's degree level in a Social Science or development-related field. Applicants with a strong pass degree and some relevant working experience will be considered.

Fee Structure: K7,000,000.00 for Malawian Nationals (or K3,500,000 per year of study); and US\$8,000.00 for international students for the entire period of study.

(v) Name of Programme: PhD in Development Studies

Programme Description: The ultimate objective of the programme is to produce PhD graduates who are knowledgeable about the developmental challenges confronting African countries and the developing world in general. The programme exposes candidates to high-level analytical skills, classical and contemporary development theories, and perspectives, and the practical side of development and underdevelopment from multidisciplinary approaches. This programme consists of the taught course and research components.

Delivery Mode: Block release involving lectures, presentations and seminars

Duration: A minimum of 3 years and a maximum of 5 years.

Additional Entry Requirements: Prospective candidates must be capable of carrying out independent research in the social sciences, using and exchanging ideas with a view to improving and critically analysing development interventions. Candidates should have a strong Master's degree from a recognized institution in a social science-related field. Candidates from other disciplines will be considered if they have some background in development-related fields.

While prospective students are welcome to propose research in any area of interest, the faculty is encouraging proposals/concept notes in the following areas: Political economy; local governance; decentralization; local development; development aid; development coordination; public policy; agrarian and environmental history; governance, institutions and policy reform processes on water and land issues; historical, cultural and social dimensions of water resources and the environment.

Fee Structure: MK13,500,000.00 for the whole period for Malawian nationals; and USD 5,000 per academic year for international students.

(h) DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT AND LEADERSHIP STUDIES

(i) Name of Programme: Master of Arts in Human Resource Management and Industrial Relations (MA HRM&IR)

Description of Programme: The programme consists of a taught coursework component in the first year, followed by independent research and preparation of an examinable thesis in the second year.

Duration: 2 years (Full time)

Mode of Delivery: Block release where students meet once every three months. The eight taught modules will cover ten weeks spread through four residential block release teaching sessions.

Additional Entry Requirements: Applicants should have a strong Bachelor's degree with a credit or strong pass (an average of 55% and above) in human resource management, industrial relations, general management, public administration and business administration. Applicants who wrote a project at the undergraduate level will have an added advantage. Those with Journalism, Humanities, and Social Science degrees will be admitted if their undergraduate programme has some human resource management or industrial relations courses and have a minimum of 2 years of working experience in management. Applicants should also submit a two-page typed brief of proposed research interests in the chosen discipline of study.

Fee Structure: MK5,250,000.00 for Malawian nationals and US\$ 8,500 for international students for the entire two-year programme.

(i) DEPARTMENT OF PRIVATE LAW

(i) Name of Programme: Master of Laws in Commercial Law [LLM (Commercial Law)]

Duration of Programme: 18 Months

Fee Structure: The tuition fee for the entire programme is MK7,875,000 or US\$10,500.00 for international students.

Description of Programme: The LLM (Commercial Law) programme consists of coursework, supervised research and a thesis. The course modules are delivered at the purpose-built Law complex where students have access to the National Bank of Malawi Postgraduate Computer Lab, which includes free access to the University of Malawi internet resources, and the Macknight Machika Resource Centre, which stocks a wide variety of up-to-date Library resources relevant to the postgraduate study of Commercial Law.

Additional Entry Requirements: Admission into the programme is open to graduates who have either: (a) a Bachelor of Laws (Honours) Upper Second Class degree (or its equivalent); or (b) A Bachelor of Laws (Honours) Lower Second Class degree (or its equivalent) and two years' experience working on matters directly related to the application of commercial law.

Eligibility:

- A. A Master's degree in law or legal studies obtained from an accredited institution of higher learning, with a minimum of a credit score, and accompanied by an academic transcript
- B. Personal Statement (500-100) that describes the applicant's motivation and capacity for pursuing the PhD in Law degree
- C. PhD Research Proposal.

Duration: 3-4 years (full-time) and 5-6 years (part-time).

- (i) **Name of Programme: Master of Science in Environmental Science (MES)**

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates to pursue a 24-month (full-time) Master of Science in Environmental Sciences (MES) programme during the 2021-2023 academic years in the Faculty of Science at the University of Malawi.
